Appreciating God's prophetic word

"Behold, I will send you Elijah the prophet before the coming of the great and dreadful day of the LORD."

(Malachi 4:5)

"before" = 'in front of', 'in the face of', 'in the presence of Insider the meaning of the words in Malachi 4:5 "great" = 'large in magnitude and extent' and 'in intensity'

from root: 'to grow', 'to become great'

"dreadful" = 'to fear', 'to revere', 'to be afraid', 'to stand in awe'

"the day of the LORD": used as a time of <u>national</u> judgement (Zechariah 14:1; Zephaniah 2:2-3)



THE IMAGE OF HUMAN POWER

"And in the days of these kings shall the God of heaven set up a kingdom, which shall never be destroyed: and the kingdom shall not be left to other people, but it shall break in pieces and consume all these kingdoms, and it shall stand for ever. 

Elijah will appear before "the Messenger of the Covenant" - the Lord Jesus Christ's Second Advent; while John the Baptist appeared before Christ's First Advent



CONNECTIONS: 'ELIJAH'S PAST' TO 'ELIJAH'S FUTURE'

We would suggest that the whole scene upon Mount Carmel has echoes of a future time - all preparing Elijah for his future work

"Gather to me all Israel unto mount Carmel"


Elijah looked forward to a greater day to come: when he would gather Israel to 'Carmel' (i.e. a land of "milk and honey" = the Land)

Independence Day (1949)





"Until the times of the gentiles be fulfilled...."



The 1967 6-Day war saw the recapture of Jerusalem, where Israel relocated its captial.

"And he repaired the altar of the LORD ..."

Elijah will do this in the Kingdom: he will help to bring about unity between the two kingdoms ('Judah' and 'Israel') in the Land of Israel

The final outcome ...?

Elijah will separate God's people from the surrounding nations; and those nations that don't accept God will be destroyed

After judgement: water

After judgements have been poured upon the nations when Christ returns, God's Word will be openly poured upon the earth in the Kingdom

The wilderness journey

Was this wilderness journey, then, reminding Elijah of Israel's 40 years of wanderings under Moses, and preparing him for a future Exodus which he would lead?

"a still small voice"

Therefore, Elijah was being developed for a future and greater work to come: when 'the voice of encouragement and persuasion' would be used to "restore all things"

Elijah's future role will be one of conversion

Elijah of the <u>past</u>

Thave been very jealous for the LORD God of hosts: because the children of Israel have forsaken thy covenant ... and I, even Lonly, am left" (1 Kings 20:14)

Elijah of the <u>future</u>

"And he shall turn the heart of the fathers to the children, and the heart of the children to their fathers ..." (Malachi 4:6)

All Israel will be saved


